## Spring Meeting April 4th Signup Now Online!!!

Mark your calendars or set your cellphone reminders for 6PM to attend the Spring Meeting at the Waveland clubhouse. League sign up will for the first time be done online. Mike Rooney has designed the website allowing us to register and pay dues via the internet, this will save postage costs and many hours of work for the Treasurer and the League Chairman. Signup must be submitted by Thursday, March 30, 2017. Due to the popularity of our league, in order to ensure your continued participation, you must have your signup submitted by the due date. If you are a team captain or wish to be a captain, get with Cory Schultes, our new League Chairman, at the Spring meeting and attend draft night on April 11th at the clubhouse. The goal of the WGA board is to

make our league experience enjoyable for all involved, which is why we hold a raffle at the Spring meeting. One free raffle ticket is issued to those attending the meeting, and extra raffle tickets can be purchased before the meeting.

## Sign Up for 2017 Match Play!

A \$10 entry fee with your League registration or at the Spring meeting gets you in. Match Play is limited to 64 players. The Match Play Committee pairs 1st round matches. Players are expected to arrange their own match times. (Matches do not have to be played on league night!). Initial matches should be completed by the end of week 3; subsequent matches are expected to be played

within two weeks of the prior match. If matches are not played in a timely manner, the back as winner trophy and Committee will contact both players to get the match played or will declare a forfeit as appropriate. Your WGA handicap at the time the match is played will be used. Players should address any questions before play starts and come to agreement, e.g. handicaps, which 9 is to be played, extended play in the

event of a tie at the end of a match, etc. All entry fees go prize money. Match Play 2016 had a field of 53. Thanks to all participants. ## Information the Membership Needs to Know

Tee times for League night are done by signup sheet at the front desk for the following week. The first night of league will have a sign up sheet available starting at 7AM Tuesday, April 18th.

In person signups will have priority over individuals calling in. A member may make a tee time for only one foursome. If you are trying to have your team play consecutive tee times, 3 individuals will need to be present to sign up.

If your foursome is able to play earlier in the day, you will need to schedule that time through the front desk...and your fellow members appreciate your efforts to ease the congestion on Tuesday night!

#### LOCAL RULES AND INFORMATION HANDOUT

Starting in 2014, the board voted to allow members age 65 and over to play from the GOLD tees. Otherwise, USGA Rules are in effect with the following exceptions:

Preferred Lies and Winter Rules exist for adverse conditions, including the poor condition of the course or the existence of mud. The Committee may decide to grant relief by temporary Local Rule either to protect the course or to promote fair and pleasant play. The Local Rule should be withdrawn as soon as the conditions warrant.

The WGA plays a modified "Winter Rules" throughout the season. A player may move the ball within one club length no nearer the hole ONLY WHEN THE BALL IS IN THE PLAYER'S OWN FAIRWAY!!! The ball is to be played down in the rough. Also, a hole is completed when a putt is holed out. The Board understands the desire to facilitate pace of play, but has voted to retain this rule and not allow "gimmes". These are the rules most of us already play by, but we get new players every year.

LEAGUE IS SCORED with 2 divisions, 9 teams per division, 12 players per team. On league night, teams play against all other teams. The low 7 net scores per team are used. Teams get 3 points for every team they beat and one point for a tie. Teams get 1 point for each team member that posts a score on a league scorecard that is received in the WGA box on league night (show-up points). The maximum points per that a team could receive on league night is 57 (45 for beating 15 teams plus 12 show-up points). Subs do not count for show-up points. Winning teams in both divisions after the first half of league play will play the winners of the second half on Playoff night to determine the league champions. Winners of the first half can't win the second half. HANDICAPS are based on the best three nine hole league scores out of the last five posted. New player handicaps are established after the first nine hole score. We will use the USGA Equitable Stroke Control System.

Nine Hole League Handicap------Maximum Strokes on any Hole

4 or less	Double Bogey
5 thru 9	7
10 thru 14	8
15 thru 19	9
20 or more	10

RAINOUTS - As long as the course allows play, there will be league. If you start your round and the course closes, be sure to turn in your cards! We will handicap the holes not played so you and your team will get credit.
