The annual WGA League Tournament has been scheduled for Sunday, July 26th. The tournament committee will apply the following local rules to 2020 participants:

- The tournament will be pre-flighted
- Current league 9-hole handicap\* as of tournament week (x 2)
- USGA GHIN handicap only if a 9-hole handicap has not been established
- No league or GHIN handicap plays as scratch
- Your handicap will still be applied within your flight
- The 4 low net scores (regardless of flight) will be selected to go to the state tournament and represent the WGA

• Number of flights and number of players per each flight will be determined by total number of entrants and their handicaps.

- Flights will be determined by the committee chairs.
- All ties will be determined by card count back.
- Will have a Scratch Champion
- Will have a Handicap Champion (regardless of flight)
- Will have great payouts with many flights.
- Will still have the same great day

#### **Reasons for Local Rules**

- You will be playing against other members with similar handicaps
- Rewards playing your best golf on tournament day
- o Eliminates the "luck of the draw" used in previous years
- o A golfer with a lower handicap can't have a bad day and win money
- Will form the best team to represent the WGA in the State tournament

2020 USGA Rules will be in effect for the tournament with the exception of playng your ball up in your own fairway. Additional exceptions may be instituted by the committee depending on course conditions at tournament time.

# Sign Up for 2020 Match Play!

A \$10 entry fee with your League registration or at the Spring Banquet gets you in. Match play is limited to 64 players. The Match Play Committee pairs the first match at random. Players are expected to promptly arrange their own match times. (Matches do not have to be played on league night!) If you have a problem setting up your match, please call Terry or Dave; numbers are posted on the board. First round matches should be completed by the end of week 3; subsequent matches are expected to be played within two weeks of the prior match. The winner of each match is responsible for posting the win on the Match Play board.

If matches are not played in a reasonable time, the Match Play Committee will contact both players to get the match played or will declare a forfeit as appropriate. Your WGA handicap at the time the match is played is used. Players should address questions before play starts and come to agreement, e.g., handicaps, which 9 is to be played, extended play in the event of a tie at the end of a match, etc.

All entry fees go back as prize money.

Match Play 2019 had a field of 50. Thanks to all who participated. Congratulations to Jeff Picken for winning the 2019 Match Play event; Bob Cochran was second; Chris Gunnare and Cory Schultes were runners-up.

# The Skins Game

In a continued effort to simplify and speed up the check in process on league nights, the Skins games will only be available on a Prepaid for the Season basis. This entry method has worked well the last couple of years and allows the WGA to provide some much larger carryover payouts! If you want in for the 18 week season, the online signup option will be your **only** opportunity to get in on the Skins games. One dollar per week for Gross and Net Skins for a grand total of \$36 will give you the chance to get your name posted as a weekly winner on the board. Winnings are paid as clubhouse credit to be used by the end of the calendar year. Be sure your birdies are circled, and scorecards with full name printed legibly are submitted into the WGA box on Tuesday. Just like the lottery, you can't win if you don't play. It just takes one really good hole to win. Go low!

Over the years we have made improvements such as the landscape sign behind the 16th tee, the flag pole off of 15th green, and the clock behind the 10th tee. John Erickson, a long time WGA member, installed the stairs on hole 4 back in 2000. The WGA board has approved funding to remove the old staircase and install a new stone staircase this spring. # WGA League Information

LEAGUE IS SCORED with 2 divisions, 9 teams per division, 12 players per team. On league night, teams play against all other teams. The low 7 net scores per team are used. Teams get 3 points for every team they beat and one point for a tie. Teams get 1 point for each team member that posts a score, preferably through the smartphone app or via scorecard in the WGA box on league night (show-up points). The maximum points per that a team could receive on league night is 63 (51 for beating 17 teams plus 12 show-up points). Subs do not count for show-up points. Winning teams in both divisions after the first half of league play will play the winners of the second half on Playoff night to determine the league champions. Winners of the first half can't win the second half.

HANDICAPS are based on the best 8 league scores posted. New player handicaps are established after the first nine hole score. We will use the World Handicap System (WHS) for Equitable Stroke Control. Maximum hole score allowed is a NET Double Bogey. Even though this is the max allowed on a hole for calculating your handicap, players must record their actual score for each hole. Our scoring and handicap system will automatically adjust to a NET Double Bogey max.

RAINOUTS - As long as the course allows play, there will be league. If you start your round and the course closes, be sure to report your scores via scorecard! We will handicap the holes not played so you and your team will get credit. A league round will be considered unviable if no more than 90 players participate on that given league day. Unviable rounds are the same as canceled rounds where points and skins will not be awarded. This determination will not be known until the next day when player attendance/scores have been calculated.

# WGA Local Rules

Starting in 2014, the board voted to allow members age 65 and over to play from the GOLD tees. Current USGA Rules are in effect with the following exceptions:

The WGA plays a modified "Winter Rules" throughout the season. A player may move the ball within one club length no nearer the hole ONLY WHEN THE BALL IS IN THE PLAYER'S OWN FAIRWAY!!! The ball normally is to be played down in the rough. During wet and muddy conditions, the ball will be played up through the hole and a player may clean it before placing it. The waterway between 3 and 7 and the 6 tee box are Ground Under Repair providing a free drop at your nearest point of relief. As always, a hole is completed when a putt is holed out. The Board understands the desire to facilitate pace of play, but has voted to retain this rule and not allow "gimmes" or "mulligans". These are the rules most of us already play by, but the league gets new players every year.

Penalty Areas - Rule 17

Penalty areas are not always marked on the course. Forest areas where grass is cut higher than the rough cut is generally considered a penalty area. A proper drop must now be made from knee height into a relief area. You may exchange your ball at this time for any reason. See rules book on how to take complete relief.

#### Out of Bounds – Local Rule

For out of bounds (#1,left on #7, #9, #14, #15, #16), place the ball in the fairway adjacent to where the ball last crossed the OB line and take 2 shot penalty i.e. laying 3 hitting 4. This may save time versus going back and hitting third shot from the tee. If hitting a provisional, be prepared to identify it from the original ball in play. Also, a provisional may be hit and still be considered a provisional to speed play. Example - first shot with driver suspected OB, provisional hit shorter with 3-iron. Provisional can be hit, then 1st shot 3 minute search can begin. In all cases, intentions for a provisional must be communicated to fellow player(s)/competitor(s) or you will merely be placing a new ball in play and your suspected OB shot will be considered abandoned even if found in the general area of play later. Also out of bounds stakes are considered immoveable objects, unlike red and yellow stakes that can be removed for a shot then returned to original locations.

Equipment touching in bunker and penalty areas

Your equipment can now touch bunkers and penalty areas with the exception of a club on a backswing in a bunker. You may not test the sand in a bunker. You can dig in to take a stance. Loose impediments may be moved in bunkers and penalty areas so long as your ball does't move. You may not move or damage attached growth. The rule of thumb is if your actions gain you an advantage it is penalty, no advantage gained - no penalty.

## THE PRINCIPAL CHARITY CLASSIC May 26th - May 31st WAKONDA CLUB - DES MOINES



The Waveland Golf Association provides marshals on Hole #12 during the Principal Charity Classic, a premier local fund raising event on the Champions Tour. This year the event runs from May 26th through May 31st. Hole captains Joe Finn and Dave Spiering will continue to organize our volunteer effort for 2020. Volunteers are expected to work at least a minimum of two six-hour shifts.

An online registration is required again this year. The volunteer package can be shipped directly to the volunteer. Last year's uniform will be reused reducing the potential fee to just \$29.00. The Volunteer Package for 2020 will still include the following:

Volunteer/Marshall Badge = FREE admission (Valued at \$100) Designated Volunteer Parking & Shuttle service Meal Voucher on Workdays (Valued at \$10/day) Volunteer Party on June 5th (Valued ???, beer and food in limited supply) Five (5) Good-Any-One-Day tickets for family and friends (Valued at \$125)

This package has an estimated value of \$300 and can be yours for just \$29 dollars if you volunteered last year. Additional uniform items and tickets may be purchased at time of registration. Jackets from previous years (current logo preferred) may be worn. The application states that because the Classic operates as a 501(c)3, your volunteer fee is tax deductible.

Volunteers park in a designated area. Shuttles will transport volunteers to the entrance. Approximate Shuttle hours:

The PCC prefers signup be done online at http://principalcharityclassic.com. If you have an ID and pasword from last year, it will not work! You will need to create an account to volunteer. The process has you select 3 unique volunteer assignments. Choose Marshals Hole 12, Marshals, and Marshals Hole 11. The last two are irrelevant, but are required to complete the signup process.
